



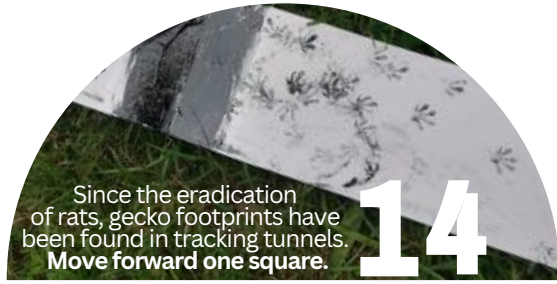
Tiriti Matangi Kids,

Tuatara are sharing the seabird burrows. **Move forward two squares.**
